# February School Violence Data Review

• Courage2Report received a total of 151 tip submissions in January

Bullying – Repeated Harassment was the most frequently submitted tip this month. The top three categories are consistent with what we typically see.

In February, we received a broad range of tips, with 28 different event types reported. It is uncommon for us to receive Human Trafficking or PRANK/FAKE Tips.



# Courage2Report Success Story – Averted School Attack

## Incident

The incident involved a threat that was made against students at a school in a social media post.

## Response

This tip came into the system as a Planned School Attack, which is categorized as a life safety tip. With this categorization, C2R analysts immediately notify school administration as well as local law enforcement. Our team then worked to locate the threat on social media and build a threat assessment analysis of the individual making threats. This information was provided to the law enforcement team to help them locate the individual.

## Resolution

Courage2Report coordinated with local law enforcement, and together we were able to identify who the individual making the threats. Law enforcement contacted the individual and conducted a threat assessment with the individual.

This ultimately led to the arrest of the individual, successfully addressing the safety concern for the students and school staff.



# School Safety Report Highlight – Suicidal Behavior in Preteens



There has been a noticeable rise in juveniles reporting suicidal thoughts and feelings of hopelessness. According to the 2023 Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System, prevalent feelings of hopelessness increased by approximately 25% from 2013 to 2023, and suicide attempts rose by 16% during the same period.

Tony Salvatore, M.A., provided an analysis of preteen suicidal behavior to help law enforcement better recognize how this issue presents in youth. His guidance emphasizes that juveniles expressing suicidal thoughts, making threats, or exhibiting behaviors indicating immediate danger should receive a comprehensive evaluation to assess their level of risk.

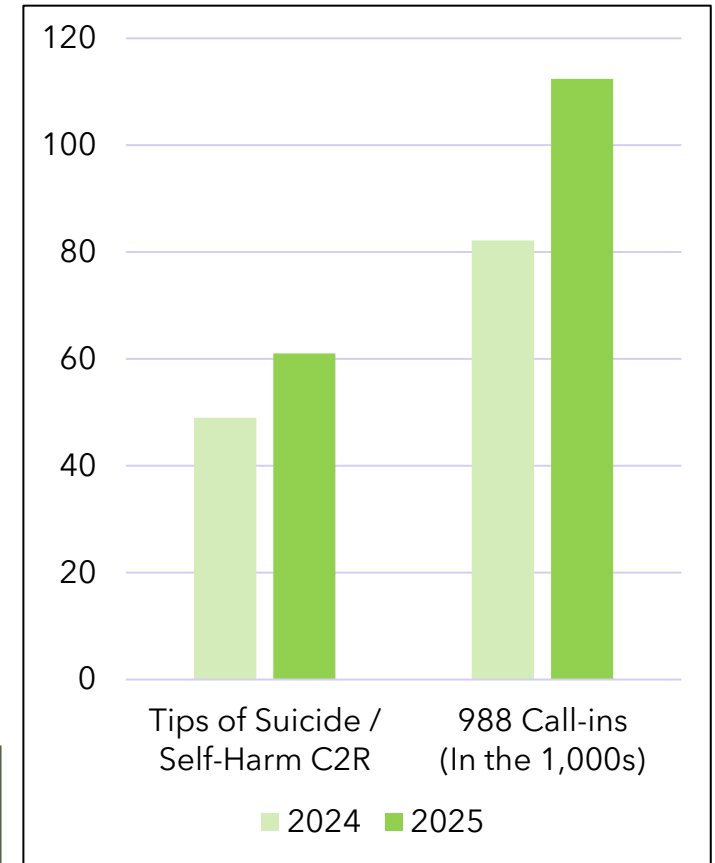
Tony Salvatore also included the Suicidal Risk Screening Tool, developed by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and the National Institute of Mental Health, to help identify individuals who may be at risk for suicide. To access the tool, [Click Here](#)

Courage2Report contacted 988 for Missouri. We identified a similar trend as Mr. Salvatore within Missouri for the last two years.

988 received 82,202 calls in 2024 and 112,418 calls in 2025. This translates to around a 27% increase in calls received.

C2R received 49 tips for Suicide Threats or Self-Harm in 2024 and 61 tips for these events in 2025. This is a 20% increase in concerning suicidal actions.
